

Succulent Care Sheet

PROPAGATION

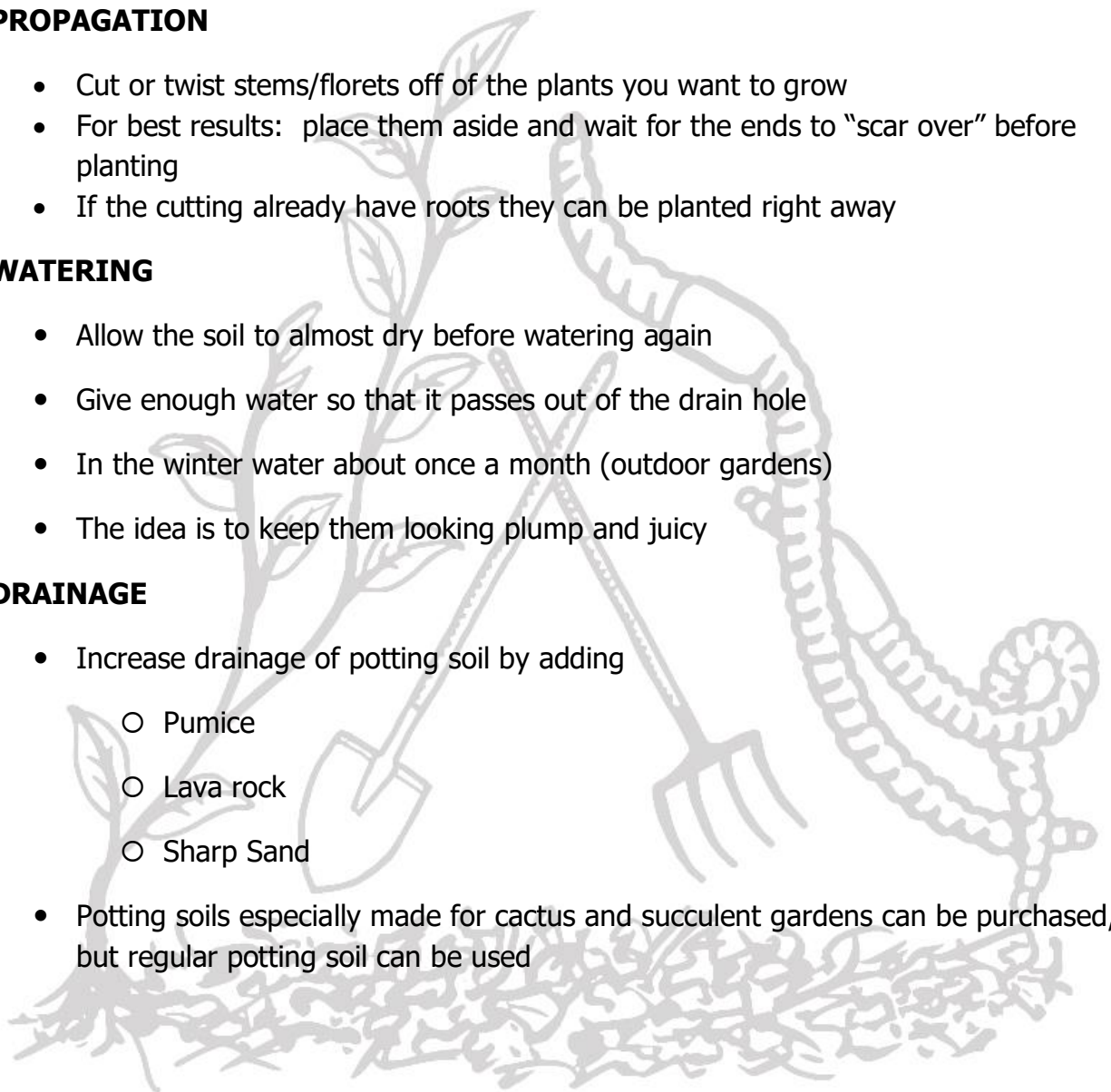
- Cut or twist stems/florets off of the plants you want to grow
- For best results: place them aside and wait for the ends to “scar over” before planting
- If the cutting already have roots they can be planted right away

WATERING

- Allow the soil to almost dry before watering again
- Give enough water so that it passes out of the drain hole
- In the winter water about once a month (outdoor gardens)
- The idea is to keep them looking plump and juicy

DRAINAGE

- Increase drainage of potting soil by adding
 - Pumice
 - Lava rock
 - Sharp Sand
- Potting soils especially made for cactus and succulent gardens can be purchased, but regular potting soil can be used



NUTRITION

- Does not require much nutrition unless your native soil is depleted
- Feed once a year
 - Diluted worm castings
 - Fish emulsion
 - Liquid versions are easier to apply for close knit succulents

SUN/SHADE

- Full sun for most varieties
- Be careful with indoor plants can too much sun can burn
- Most need 6 hours of sun
- Please be sure indoor gardens get indirect or morning light

CONTAINERS

- The sky is the limit when it comes to containers!!
- Even planters that would be toxic for edible plants
 - Tires
 - Cider blocks
 - Treated pallets
 - Shoes, cans, plastic containers, tins
- Reuse options are endless!!!
- Just be sure to provide enough drainage!!!
