



Solano CAO signs \$365,000 in contracts

FAIRFIELD — Solano County Administrator Birgitta Corsello has signed seven contracts for a bit more than \$365,000 since the last Significant Issues memo was issued May 20, according to the memo issued Monday.

However, the last published contract signed dates back to December.

The largest of the contracts signed under her authority were \$74,861 to John Jow to provide dental services, primarily prosthetics, to residents of Solano County, and \$70,833 to Dr. Firgouse Huq to provide psychiatric services to Solano County patients.



Birgitta E. Corsello is Solano County's top administrator.

The funding source for dental services is listed as Federally Qualified Health Centers program revenues. The sources for the psychiatric care funding are Short Doyle and 2011 Realignment.

Each contract runs from July 1 to June 30 the county reported.

The CAO has authority to sign contracts of less than \$75,000. The county includes contracts starting at \$25,000.

Other contracts include:

• \$29,970 to Sustainable Solano Inc. to complete work on the local food system program, from March 15, 2021, to June 30, 2022. The funding source is Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation grant funds.

• \$40,000 to Gloria Carrol to cover mental health services to Solano County clients through the Managed Care Network Providers from Dec. 1, 2020, to Nov. 30, 2022. The funding sources are Short Doyle and 2011 Realignment.

\$40,000 with Katrina Copeland to cover mental health services to Solano County clients through the Managed Care Network Providers from Jan. 1, 2021, to Jan. 29, 2023. The funding sources are Short Doyle and 2011 Realignment.
\$40,000 to Judge Technical Services Inc. to recruit and obtain the placement of a candidate to fill the clinic operations officer position within Family Health Services of the Department of Health and Social Services, with a contract term from April 1 to Sept. 30. The funding source is FQHC Revenues.

• \$69,379 to California State University, Fresno Foundation to provide direct training, field-based training and coaching to Child Welfare Services staff from July 1 to June 30. The funding sources are federal Title IV-E funds and 1991 and 2011 Realignment.
