Suisun wants input on climate change challenges

SUISUN CITY — The city is seeking input about climate change and how it should address potential threats.

A report compiled by the city, Sustainable Solano and The Nature Conservancy, which came out of a June community meeting, outlines the issues. It will be presented to the City Council on Sept. 6.

“Recent events such as severe wildfires, extreme precipitation events, high winds, and extended heat waves have reinforced this urgency and compelled leading communities like the city of Suisun City to proactively collaborate on planning and develop actions that mitigate risks and enhance resilience across their municipality,” an overview of the report states.

Flooding is of particular concern for the city.

Highlights of the report, according to a statement issued by the city, include identifying some high-priority areas for possible action:

- Access grants to install preventive flood infrastructure such as living-levees and pump stations.
- Implement hazard and warning signs along flood-prone roadways to increase public awareness.
- Bring findings to the City Council to get flooding prevention measures enacted and to incorporate actions by neighboring Bay Area communities.
- Secure funds to continue vulnerability assessments and planning over the next 10 years.

Environment and Climate Committee, which meets on the fourth Monday of each month. The participation is also encouraged in a special listening session as part of the Suisun City Festival planned for Oct. 22.

“The festival will have a special focus on the report this year, with a speaker on the challenges Suisun City faces, presentations from Sustainable Solano’s Resilient Neighborhoods interns, and a listening session with city officials and community leaders around the report and community-directed action to address these challenges,” the city stated.

Sustainable Solano will be at the #IARTSuisun community art event Sept. 17, and a Suisun City Flood Walk is planned from 4 to 5 p.m. the second and fourth Saturdays of each month.

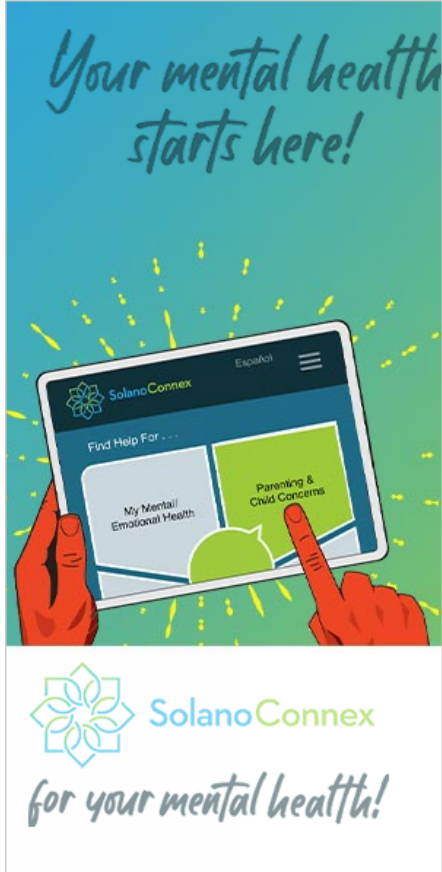
