Shoreline walking tours set for Suisun City, Vallejo

SUISUN CITY — Greenbelt Alliance and Sustainable Solano are hosting a pair of walking tours for late February and March as part of the Solano Bayshore Resiliency Project.

Meg Herston, director of Environmental Services for the Fairfield-Suisun Sewer District, will be part of the tour set for Feb. 28 in Suisun City. The tour begins at the Harbor Plaza where a community mapping activity, and a chance to win a \$50 gift card, will start at 9:30 a.m. The tour starts at 11.

"You'll get the chance to learn about how sea level rise is shaping the shoreline from local expert Meg Herston," organizers said. "We want to hear about the places you love in Suisun City and Fairfield and your hopes for the future of the waterfront. Through collaboration and connection, we can prepare Suisun City for sea level rise."

The event is set to end at 1 p.m.

The second tour is set for March 7 with "an interactive walking tour" starting at the Vallejo Ferry Terminal, during which the potential impacts of sea level rise and adaptation solutions will be discussed.

Jeremy Lowe, senior environmental scientist at the San Francisco Estuary Institute and a Vallejo resident, will be part of the tour.

"There will be light bites and coffee. Those who attend the walking tour will receive a \$10 gift card after completing a short survey. Translation services are available upon request and families are encouraged to bring young ones to connect with the shoreline," organizers said.

"We want to hear about any concerns you may have about sea level rise impacts in Vallejo, your relationship to the shoreline, and solutions you hope to see in the future."

The event is scheduled for 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. The tour begins at 11.
